Introduction

In 1964, Congress passed the Economic Opportunity Act to begin America's War on Poverty. This act created a special funding stream for communities to address poverty on the local level. Community Actions developed across the nation to support low-income individuals in improving the quality of their lives. The Community Action Commission of Fayette County was incorporated in 1967. The funds from the federal government go to the Ohio Development Service's Agency Office of Community Assistance and is then granted to the Community Action Commission of Fayette County (CACFC).

Today, the CACFC manages close to 7.5 million in federal, state, local, and private funds. The agency is home to over 100 employees and over 25 different programs. CACFC primarily serves Fayette County, Ohio. However, the agency has roots in Clinton, Highland, Ross, Greene, Madison, and Pickaway Counties as well. These programs include:

Every three years, all Community Action Agencies must conduct a community needs assessment to inform the strategies of its strategic plan. This needs assessment describes community needs, service delivery strategies based on those needs, and directions for building the capacity of the agency and community to meet local needs. This needs assessment's focus is on Fayette County, Ohio and will span calendar years of 2018, 2019, and 2020.

The Community Needs Assessment (CNA) must meet the following standards:

- 1.1 Low income individuals participate in the CNA.
- 1.2 The organization analyzes information collected directly from low-income individuals as a part of the community needs assessment.
- 1.3 The organization has a systematic approach for collecting, analyzing, and reporting customer satisfaction data to the governing board.
- 3.1 Conduct an assessment and issue a report within the past three years.
- 3.2 Collection of data specific to poverty and its prevalence related to gender, age, and race/ethnicity for the service area.
- 3.3 Include both quantitative and qualitative data.
- 3.4 Include key findings on the causes and conditions of poverty in the community.
- 3.5 Have the CNA approved by the Board of Directors.

Mission, Vision, and Approach

Mission Statement

The mission of the Community Action Commission of Fayette County is to combat causes of poverty, expand community services, and implement projects necessary to provide services and further community improvements.

Its mission is also to consider the problems concerning youth, adults and senior citizens and deal with the prevention and solving of those problems.

The provision of affordable housing is a specific purpose of the agency, as is the development of income-generating projects consistent with the purposes of the corporation which will increase funds available for services and reduce the agency's dependence on public funds.

Vision Statement

Our vision is to facilitate the development of effective community programs that provide every individual and neighborhood in our community the opportunity to thrive.

Approach

Offering support services and providing basic needs to which all people have a right.

- Developing opportunities for people with low incomes. Increasing public awareness about the challenges that many people with low incomes face.
- Ensuring that people with low incomes provide the leadership in the decisions that affect their lives.
- Engaging many voices in promoting human rights and economic justice.
- Advocating for policies that help and taking a stand against policies that hurt those living with low incomes.

Assessment & Planning Process

This Community Needs Assessment (CNA) was developed utilizing the tools discussed in this section below and included in the appendices of this CNA.

- Compilation of data specific to poverty and its prevalence related to gender, age, and race/ethnicity for the service area obtained from Community Commons on 7/17/2017 at www.communitycommons.com.
- Customer Satisfaction Surveys created on 6/7/17 and available at https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/CACFCCS. These surveys were created by the agency's Planner and distributed by the agency's frontline staff.
- Community Needs Assessment Survey created on 7/7/17 and available at
 https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/cacna. This survey was developed through research of the agency's planner
 and posted on the agencies website, on Facebook and featured in the local paper.
- 5 focus groups with 50 low-income individuals during Getting Ahead from January through June 2017. These focus groups were chaired by the following staff and consultants: Mellinda Hellard, Jennifer Guisinger, Tracey Hixon, Stacey Johnson, and Vickey Leisure.
- Data pulled from the Homeless Management Information System and the OCEAN Database regarding agency activities.

Discussion of Low Income Involvement

The CACFC engaged low income individuals in the following ways to participate in the needs assessment:

- Conducted focus groups through the Getting Ahead Program from 1/1/17-6/30/17. Their feedback is discussed in the analysis section. 50 low income individuals participated in the focus groups.
- Conducted outreach to program participants to fill out Customer Satisfaction Surveys and the Needs Assessment Survey face to face at time of service, online (both Facebook and the CACFC website), and in the local paper.
- 37 Customer Satisfaction Surveys were submitted and 46 Needs Assessment Surveys were completed by low income individuals.

Community Profile

The Community Action Commission of Fayette County (CACFC) is the designated Community Action Agency for Fayette County, Ohio. In total, the service area includes the cities of Bloomingburg, Jeffersonville, Milledgeville, Octa, New Holland, and the county seat, Washington Court House. With an area of 406.36 square miles and a population density of 70.8 per square mile, Fayette County is less dense than the state and national average. Population in Fayette County has actually been on the decline for some time as many individuals leave the community for increased economic opportunity. The largest segments of its population are between 5-17 and over 65.

Compared to the rest of the state and nation, CACFC's service area has relatively low levels of racial and ethnic diversity. The vast majority (95%) of the population identifies as white. Fayette County's disabled population is 16.37%, greater than both the nation and state. Individuals that report as multi-racial or black were also identified as disabled at greater rates than whites, with 24.4 and 23.2. Most notably, almost half of Native American/Alaska Natives were disabled. Only 1.6% of the population has limited English proficiency. 38.21% of that population identifies as Hispanic.

Within the report area 2,854 public school students or 58.89% are eligible for Free/Reduced Price lunch out of 4,846 total students enrolled. 16% of the total population is identified as experiencing food insecurity at some point during the year. 24% of children were identified as food insecure. 22% of these food insecure children are not eligible for any

assistance. There are free meals available in the community every day of the week and six faith-based organizations running food pantries.

Fayette County is home to two public school districts and the Fayette Christian private schools. 91.8% of all students in the 2014-2015 school year received their diploma. While WCH City Schools shows a grade of A for improvement and B for graduation, all other performance rankings are a D or lower. Miami Trace shows a grade of B for improvement and A for graduation, but all other performance indicators are graded as a C or lower. This is relevant because research suggests that education is one of the strongest indicators of health.

Transportation is a challenge for many low income families in Fayette County. While only 6.64% of all household's report having no motor vehicle, the local transit system is often overwhelmed. Fayette County Transportation provided over 39,500 trips in 2016 alone. The vast majority of these trips were for employment (almost 26,000) with medical following with medical following (around 7,000).

The housing market in Fayette County is very challenging. 33% of all households pay more than 30% of their income towards their housing. The housing stock, as projected by the census, is around 12,680 units. Approximately 60% of those units are owner occupied. Focus groups with low-income individuals indicated that rental housing that will pass inspection is difficult to find and that many individuals have had to move outside of their school district or the county at times when unable to locate affordable, quality housing. This is supported by the fact that the county has 32% of its housing units being occupied with one or more substandard conditions.

Ohio Development Service Agency's county profile indicates that 8.5% of the county's housing units are vacant. 64% of the housing stock was built before the 1980's. The greatest percentage of homes are valued between \$60-79,999.

Fayette County does fair better than the state and nation in terms of access to HUD-Assisted units with 674 units in the county. 368 are HCV, 248 are Project-Based, and 58 are HUD 202. The county is also home to 587 Low Income Housing Tax Credit units.

The median household income in the community is \$49,222, well below the state and national median incomes of \$62,817 and \$66,011 respectively. Married couples, singles, and single fathers far out earn single females with children. Single father's median income is \$31,071 and single mother's median income is \$18,761. While no data is available for most minority groups, Asian's median income is shown to be \$90.089, followed by white at \$50,260, multi-racial at \$41,563. Individuals reporting as Hispanic/Latino make the lowest median income of \$24,853. Overall, Fayette County reports 5-7,000 less in per capita income that the state and nation.

Fayette County has a higher usage rate for public supports than the state and nation. 4% of residents receive OWF/General Assistance. 515 households receive about \$2,209 in public assistance. 28% receive Medicaid. These individuals are more frequently under 18 and over 65, comprising 58% of the Medicaid population.

The county is both a mental health professional shortage area and a medically underserved community. Currently, Fayette County has two substance abuse treatment providers, Fayette Recovery and Scioto Paint Valley Mental Health. There is a total of 14 mental and 11 primary healthcare providers in the entire county. A total of 12% of the entire population is uninsured. However, this issue impacts blacks being disproportionally uninsured at 32%.

The area also has more families on SNAP than the state and national averages, with 19% of the population receiving SNAP. These benefits are also disproportionately depended upon by black (26%), other racial (75%), and multi-racial (34%) families. The county has 31 Authorized SNAP retailers, allowing higher access than the state and national average.

In terms of education, the community also lags the state and nation in terms of individuals with a high school diploma, associate's degree, or bachelor's degree. This is likely due to a large portion of the community leaving for college and frequently not returning or moving for economic opportunity. 15% of the population has no high school diploma, 22% has an associate's or higher, and 14% reports having a bachelor's degree or higher. 42% of the Hispanic population does not have a high school diploma.

Poverty in the community also follows these trends. 28% of the county's children are 100% under the Federal Poverty Level. 80% of the county's Hispanic children are in poverty tract. Then 56% of the county's children are 200% under FPL. As a percentage of the total population, 18% of all residents are under 100% FPL and 42% are under 200% FPL. Again, Hispanics are over represented with over 50% reporting at 100% FPL.

The current unemployment rate for the county is 3.9%. Over the course of May 2016-May 2017 rates ranged from as low at 3.4% to 5.4%. The county's rate is slightly less than the United States.

Due to many health-related factors and access to care, the county ranks 76 out 81 in terms of health outcomes. Most notable are its teen pregnancy rates (49) and obesity rates (33%) being greater than other Ohio Counties, according to the County Health Rankings produced by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. The county also has a preventable ambulatory care sensitive condition discharge rate a full 21 points over the state and 22.7 points over the state and national averages at 72.6. The county also has a high tobacco consumption rate of 31%, a full 10-12% over the state and national average.

The community has been overrun by the opiate epidemic. Recent data shows Fayette County being in the top 2/3 of Ohio's counties in terms of impact of the opiate problem. The age adjusted death rate is 22.2 versus the state average of 19.6 and national average of 13.4. Past 30-day use data obtained of surveys of the two local school districts showed 23% of 10th graders reporting alcohol use, 13% reporting marijuana use, and 5% reporting the illegal use of prescription drugs.

Poverty Specific Profile

Poverty - Population Below 100% FPL

Poverty is considered a key driver of health status.

Within the report area 18.45% or 5,185 individuals are living in households with income below the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). This indicator is relevant because poverty creates barriers to access including health services, healthy food, and other necessities that contribute to poor health status.






Population in Poverty by Gender







Assistance Income






Insurance - Population Receiving Medicaid

have multiple health access, health status, and social support needs; when combined with poverty data, providers can use this measure to identify gaps in eligibility and enrollment.



Population Receiving Medicaid by Age Group, Percent




Percent Population Age 18-64 Without Medical Insurance



Percent Uninsured Population






Uninsured Population by Gender




Uninsured Population by Age Group, Total




Uninsured Population by Race Alone, Percent



Households Receiving SNAP Benefits by Race/Ethnicity, Total



Population Receiving SNAP Benefits (SAIPE)








Population with No High School Diploma by Gender



Conditions & Causes of Poverty in Fayette County

Many Fayette County families do not have enough household income to meet their basic needs. As a result, they are also unable to afford quality and/or safe housing, access reliable transportation, and pay for their most basic health care needs. Additionally, once individuals in poverty reach a minimal increase in income, they experience the benefits cliff. Many low income individuals indicated this as a major reason for their continued poverty.

Employment:

Low income households and members of the CAC Board of Directors indicated that employment is one of the largest causes of poverty in the community. The problem is two-fold.

The CACFC conducted a focus group with local employers in late 2016 regarding their largest problems. Local employers indicated that the community lacks a workforce. Many of their higher paid positions remain unfilled. Local employers indicated that most individuals do not show up for drug screens. They frequently recruit outside of the area. Local employers also pointed to the lack of affordable, reliable transportation.

Focus groups with low income individuals resulted in very different perceptions. Low income households indicated that many jobs they were able to perform were low paying and could not replace the benefits they would stand to lose. They also pointed to transportation issues being a barrier to maintaining employment. They also indicated that many local employers use of temporary agencies made it difficult to find permanent positions they could rely upon to pay their bills.

Affordable Housing Stock

Fayette County's renters are extremely housing burdened. 68% of the county's housing stock was build prior to 1970. 1,079 units are sitting vacant. Only 710 units are available for rent under \$500/month. Both in focus groups and the Community Needs Assessment Survey, affordable housing was rated as the top reason for poverty in the community and something the agency should address to move individuals out of poverty.

Substance Abuse

The 2017 Fayette County Community Health Assessment identified substance abuse as the top public health concern. Like many other counties in Ohio and across the county, Fayette County has been overrun by the opioid epidemic. The Ohio Mental Health & Addiction Services Administration categorized the county as being a tier 2 community based upon its overdose data from 2010-2015. Tier 2 communities comprise the top half of all counties ranked for overdose death. Fayette County is ranked 11th for its average age-adjusted unintentional drug overdose death rate per 100,000 population from 2010-2015 with this data source. The Ohio Department of Health shows that with a rate of 28.1, the Fayette County death rate is 1.5 times the state average.

Ohio is 4th in the nation in overdose deaths, according to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention. During the coalition's 2016 needs assessment, there were 2,753 individuals in treatment and 111 patients receiving naloxone from EMS personnel in 2015. In 2016, the local hospital reported over 200 overdose cases at the emergency room and 202 doses of naloxone were administered to 139 patients by EMS services, for a total of 402 overdoses.

The Fayette County jail was constructed in the 1800s and was only made to house 24 inmates at a time. Since the epidemic, the jail is often over capacity, with over 70 individuals in the jail. The county recently purchased a scanner for inmates and visitors, as two individuals have died from overdoses in the jail within the past year. The Sheriff's Office conducted a survey in the summer of 2016 and found that 95% of inmates identified opiates as being their drug of choice which directly resulted in their incarceration. Needs assessment data shows that 349 cases were related to substance misuse in 2015. Job and Family Services reports that 68% of their cases are related to substance use.

A lack of access to care presents barriers to good health, but can be deadly when it comes to substance abuse. The supply and accessibility of facilities and physicians, the rate of uninsurance, financial hardship, transportation barriers, cultural competency, and coverage limitations affect access to treatment.

Community needs assessment data also supports a race disparity in the community. Individuals reporting as Black/African American, American Indian, Hispanic, or other race experience poverty and its associated impacts at greater rates than their white counterparts.

Female Head of Households

As noted in the poverty profile section above, female headed households are also disproportionately impacted by poverty. The more children in the household, the greater the rates of poverty.

Community Needs Assessment Survey Analysis

The Community Needs Assessment Survey was analyzed to distinguish between consumers and low income input and all community stakeholders. The top ten priorities for each group is listed below and further analyzed in this section.

Focus groups with low income individuals also had similar themes. These themes included: affordable housing, shelter, substance abuse and prevention services, and the expansion of transportation services available.

Affordable Housing – Across stakeholder groups, affordable housing continues to be a high priority for the agency.

Prescription Assistance – Low income individuals still identified the need for prescription assistance. As such, the agency will continue to search for more sources for the Salvation Army program.

Substance Abuse – The substance abuse issue in the community is impacting multiple programs. The increase in individuals impacted by opioid misuse disorder has resulted in increased law enforcement, court, jailing, and treatment costs. EMS personnel and hospital staff are inundated with individuals overdosing. Low income and other stakeholder groups alike have identified this critical need in our community. Low income individuals recognize that treatment

options are scarce for individuals on Medicaid and facilities have long waiting lists. The agency is working on the Faith in Recovery Coalition to increase treatment options in the community.

Domestic Violence – The local domestic violence shelter recently closed, resulting in a lack of services and housing for victims of domestic violence. The agency will look into VOCA, VAWA, and OCJS funding to fill this gap.

Temporary Shelter – The local shelter's configuration does not lend itself to serving single, homeless men. The state and federal government's priorities are to not open more shelters. While Housing First (placing individuals into housing rather than in shelter) is a wonderful idea, lacking a men's shelter results in individuals continuing to sleep on the streets until housing can be found. Individuals are often reluctant to cross county lines for shelter due to their connection to the community and transportation issues. The agency will continue to pursue partnerships and will begin researching other sites that meet the agency's current budget.

Enrichment Programs for Youth – The community is interested in increasing protective factors and decreasing risk factors for local youth. The agency is currently working on substance abuse prevention youth-led coalitions that will be expanded over the next year to include alternate activities for youth.

Rent Assistance – Along with affordable housing and the prioritization of HUD to serve literally homeless individuals, few resources exist for rent assistance in the community. The agency will continue to seek out partnerships with the local MHA to find new funds to serve this need.

Emergency Medical Care – Many low income families and other stakeholders recognize that the area is often underrepresented with primary and other emergency care. The agency will be joining the Rural Health Association to look at opportunities to solve this critical need.

Substance Abuse Prevention – At the time of the formulation of this document, the agency received the Drug Free Communities Support Program to expand substance abuse prevention activities in the community.

Transportation – The agency's transit program struggles to keep up with the demand for its services. The agency is exploring alternatives like point deviated routes, additional contracts with local employers, and the development of a volunteer driver programs to meet the needs of individuals whose circumstances do not have a funding source.

Customer Satisfaction Approach

Collection – Customer Satisfaction Surveys are distributed by front-line staff at the time of service. The CACFC has a customer service feedback box for program participants to submit their surveys anonymously. The survey is also available online on the Community Action website and is distributed on the agency's Facebook page. The Community Needs Assessment also includes a section on rating your experience with each type of program CACFC operates.

Analysis – The agency's receptionist enters survey data into Survey Monkey. The agency Planner analyzes the feedback annually and reports to the Board. Survey Monkey has the ability to filter by program type. The Planner did filter the data to identify if program participants had more positive or negative feedback based upon the programs they were using. However, what the Planner found was that the majority of customers were visiting and reported on multiple services. During the annual survey update, the Planner will work to create different surveys and/or lines of questioning specific to each program for more individualized feedback. To analyze customer feedback on the Community Needs Assessment Survey, the Planner filtered the results by low-income participants/consumers only.

Reporting Data to the Board – The agency's Planner will distribute the PDF of the Survey Monkey Customer Feedback results to the Board of Directors on an annual basis. As the surveys are improved and customers submit more feedback, Program Managers may be better able to make adjustments to their programs based upon those results.

The reports from the CNA and Satisfaction Survey are in the Appendices of this document.

Customer Satisfaction Analysis

For the most part, customer satisfaction reported on the Customer Satisfaction Surveys was overwhelmingly positive. Customers reported fast, respectful, knowledgeable service being provided across program types. Only two respondents indicated that they "did not know" if they would recommend Community Action to others. Only one respondent indicated that the CAC employee needed more knowledge of community resources.

In the Community Needs Assessment Survey, all "don't know answers" where the individual responding was not familiar with the program was excluded from analysis. The percentages of responses are tabulated below:

The three programs with the most negative feedback included transit, mobility management, and homeless programs. Focus group participants indicated that the following issues were present in those programs:

Transit and Mobility Management: The need for a free transit, shuttle service in town, more transit to employment, and more on-time trips. Mobility Management low-income participants expressed frustration at the lack of out of county transportation available to non-Medicaid eligible populations under the age of 60.

Needs Assessment Recommendations for this issue: The transit program is piloting a point deviated route service and the Mobility Manager is researching the feasibility of a volunteer driver program to expand out of county services. The Mobility Management funding source restricts the Mobility Manager's ability to do fundraising. As such, grants will be submitted to foundations to find alternative revenue sources for this need.

Homeless Programs: Focus group participants shared their frustration in the lack of emergency shelter beds in the community, specifically those available to single men.

Needs Assessment Recommendations for this issue: The state of Ohio continues to not fund new shelters in the Ohio and encourages cross county collaboration for gaps in homeless services and the use of rapid re-housing funds to place homeless individuals directly into housing. As such, the agency must continue to look for alternate sites for the county's homeless shelter that are affordable utilizing the \$87,500 the shelter receives each year to fund 24 hour staffing and operating funds. NIMBY issues continue to be a challenge as well as properties suitable for congregate living that would provide separate living spaces for single men and households with children. Alternate sites will continue to be sought out to fill this need.

Appendices

Focus Groups Recommendations

Group 1

Recommendations from GA session #1

1. Youth

Investigators reported that they would like to see a facility, youth oriented. Something for the younger individuals in our community. Like the Warehouse.

They expressed the need for a movie theater.

WCH Pool and/or small water park.

2. Transportation

The group expressed their concern about our current transportation services and the need for improvement, such as pick-ups, being on time, one route to Wal-Mart and back through town.

They recommended specific shuttle services to work sites/Industrial Park and to out of county jobs as well, ie; Mt. Sterling, Wilmington, for all shifts. Bus passes for low income and individuals who are just starting a new position and have no money to ride the bus.

3. Child Care

Recommendations from the group specified needing day care sites at local factories. They expressed the desire to be able to take their child to work with them and to have an on-site day care. The individuals working would not have to leave the premises to address any needs or concerns with their child.

Additional affordable day care. Parents are not pleased with the State providers.

4. Housing

Additional affordable housing.

Men's shelter

Additional beds/rooms at our current local shelter. Families have reported not wanting to go to a shelter out of county due to their children being enrolled in school in WCH/Trace and/or the individual just received employment and is unable to get back and forth if they went out of county.

5. Predatory Lending

GA participants were angered by these lending places. They expressed the need to make the public aware of the fine print and/or no print, for the lending obligations.

6. Recovery Housing

Participants felt that individuals who are released from jail or rehab need a safe place to return to. The group discussed the high risk of repeating the addiction behavior and/or the crimes associated with the behavior, if returned back to the same environment.

7. Boards

The GA graduates expressed the need for more community residents to be a part of community board meetings. They suggested having "local boards" invite the general public and encourage them to express their opinions and suggestions and for the boards to "listen" to what the public has to say.

Group 2

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR A MORE EQUITABLE AND HEALTHY FAYETTE COUNTY

The following items were determined as a result of a "Getting Ahead" (GA) group of investigators. This GA group is one of several being facilitated in Fayette County. It is being funded by the Healthier Buckeye Grant, managed by the Fayette County Community Action Commission.

Most GA members have, at some time in their lives, been in need of more resources to stabilize their lives. The objective of all GA members is to facilitate for themselves and the local community opportunities to move from getting by to getting ahead.

1. Transportation

- Compared to nearby communities, Fayette County falters in providing low-cost reliable transportation.
- Local temporary placement agencies report that lack of reliable transportation is the number one reason new hires are released.
- Recommendations include a shuttle service with specific pick-up times throughout the county and city, timely runs to and from the mall, and runs to various work sites such as the Industrial Park.
- A Mt. Sterling organization rep states he could hire fifty WCH residents if a shuttle could be provided.

2. Housing

- GA Investigators report a wait-time of over a year for safe and affordable housing is not uncommon.
- GA Investigators have been forced to remove their entire family, including school-age children, to a nearby community to obtain quick and safe shelter.
- Officials need to seek immediate and long-term solutions to providing affordable housing opportunities and more beds in local shelters.

3. Predatory Lending

- GA Investigators researched this issue and found interest and fees can exceed 200 percent!
- All efforts should be made to encourage a credit union to establish in our area.

4. Drug Court

- Drug Offenses occurring years ago continue to present a barrier to stability.
- A Drug Court should be immediately established in Fayette County with an emphasis on preparing an exit plan for offenders to rehabilitate and remove themselves from the jail cycle.

5. Criminality

- Criminal Offenders may experience great difficulty stabilizing their lives, as records shadow them for decades.
- Persuasions should be made to move to a point system, such as in driving issues, allowing for points to fall off as the years progress.

6. Pest Free

- Many care to rid themselves and their homes of pests such as fleas, lice and bedbugs, however; they cannot afford the treatments or products.
- Grants should be pursued to procure products for pest elimination. These should be free and perhaps dispensed by the local health department.

7. Recreation

- Kudos to the city for sponsoring the Scarecrow Festival! A job well done!
- The outdoor pool needs to be reestablished and offered at low cost.
- More playgrounds not connected to schools should be built.
- Adult supervision of free activities at area parks should be provided over summer breaks.
- Any free entertainment options are welcomed.
- \$. Benefits and Resources
- Assistance is cut as soon as one improves his or her life.
- Benefits should continue for a period of months allowing citizens to fully stabilize and be able to remain stabilized.

9. Communications

- Superb programs that could help one get ahead often go unnoticed.
- A common posting of all free and helpful opportunities should be placed in a specific

section of the Shoppers' Guide to generate participation and assist residents .

Group 3

Transportation

1. GA Graduates expressed concern about current transportation and not having the \$1.00 to ride round trip. They live with no income and some of them living on the out-skirts of the county, makes it too far to walk and/or ride a bike.

Medicaid

1. Graduates expressed concern about losing their current Medicaid and how they would receive medical treatment for current conditions, if they lose their benefits.

Local Boards

Graduates recommended that local boards welcome and/or invite the general public, low income
individuals and homeless. Also, recommended that they "be asked" for their feedback on topics being
discussed because they feel intimidated by the community leaders and will not speak up. They felt "left
out" even when they were at the table. They also expressed concern for their voices not being heard, if
they did speak out.

Men's Shelter

1. The group consisted of mostly men, so their concern for our community to have a men's shelter was a hot topic. Mostly concerned about not having one and the disadvantages of having to go out of town to get off the streets, when they want to stay in WCH.

Group 4

GA Investigators discussed the importance of all resources that are currently in Fayette County. They also discussed the need for additional resources to help all community members be able to rise above poverty.

The most significant need they came up with was more affordable housing. A competitiveness is absent when dealing with the local landlords and they keep inflating the rent prices. The investigators researched Fair housing laws and tenant rights and responsibilities to learn more about 2017 housing standards.

Other recommendations were discussed as well and included the following:

- Childcare
- Transportation
- "Buy Here, Pay Here" car dealerships
- Predatory Lending
- Youth (activities, drug prevention, Big Brother, Big Sister programs)
- More local activities (movie theater, drive in movies, pool, Go Kart racetrack)
- Birthing unit at FCMH
- Streets and sidewalks maintained better.

- Different support groups
- Neighborhood watches
- Recovery Housing

Group 5

2017 YouthBuild/Getting Ahead Recommendations

Top Priority:

Efficient and affordable transportation to and from work sites, as well as other stops such as local colleges and service agencies.

Top Five Priorities for Community Improvement:

- 1. Reinstall a theatre and possibly a drive-in movie site.

- 5. Affordable and available housing of all types (bank-owned opened to be a rental, additional homeless shelter beds, veteran rooms, other).




Q1 What type of service(s) did you seek at CACFC?

Q1 Which category best describes you? (Check all that apply)





Q2 What is your age group?







Total Population by Gender







Population Age 65 by Ethnicity Alone



























Adults Ever Smoking 100 or More Cigarettes by Race / Ethnicity, Percent












Percentage of Medicare Population with Depression by Year, 2010 through 2015








Percentage of Medicare Population with Diabetes by Year, 2010 through 2015






Percentage of Medicare Population with Heart Disease by Year, 2010 through 2015







Cancer Mortality, Age-Adjusted Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by Gender







Coronary Heart Disease Mortality, Age-Adjusted Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by Gender


